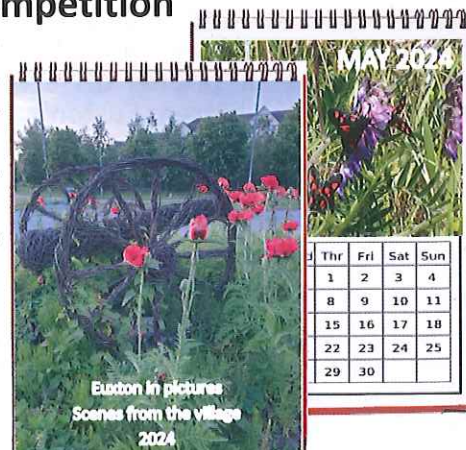

The All Purposes Committee wanted to think of a way to remind residents how wonderful Euxton looks through the seasons - and thought of a calendar.

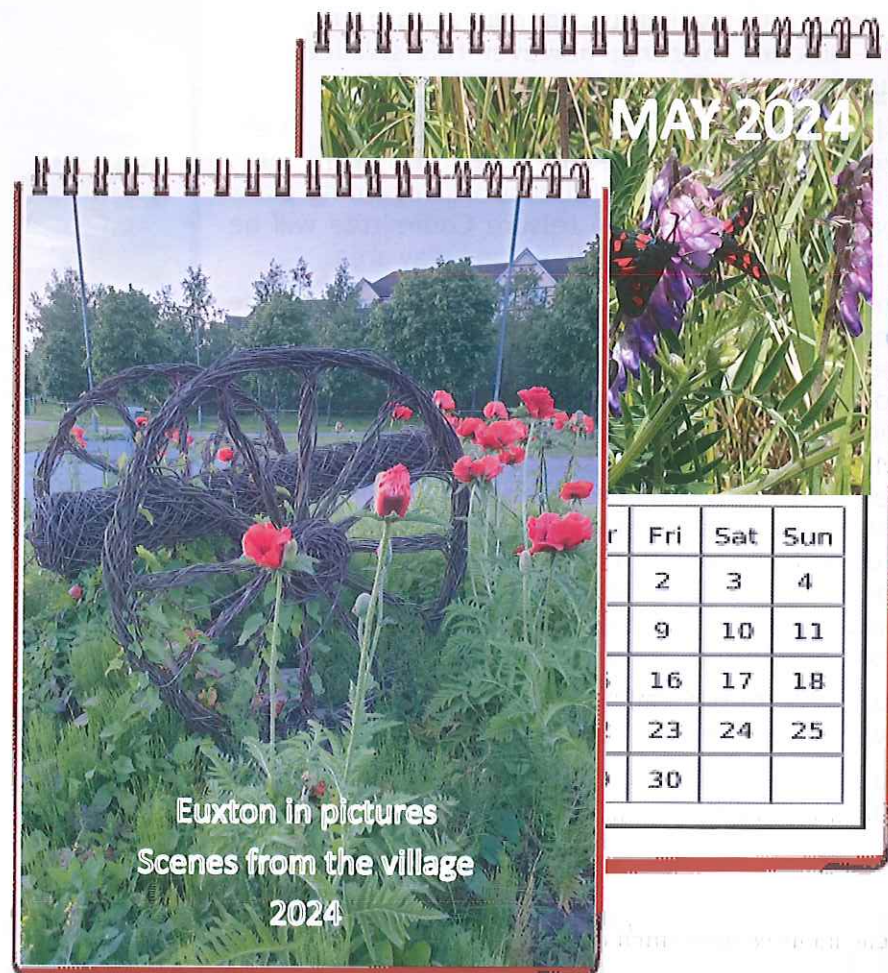
But, to be able to do this it would require some glorious photos from all around the village, in different months and seasons during the year - from you!.

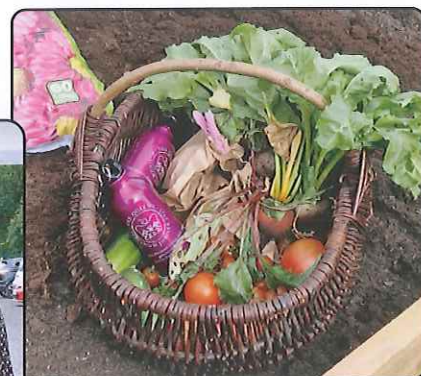


In September the Council hosted an official opening ceremony for Euxton's Allotment site.

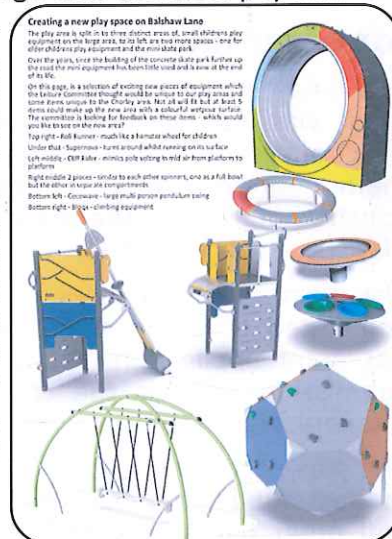
Balshaw Lane new play space

EUXTON PARISH COUNCIL

Councillor Vacancy - Euxon Ward

Presently there is a vacancy for a Parish Councillor on the Council to be filled by co-option.

Applications are invited and any person wishing to serve as a Councillor should write to the Clerk giving details of interests, experience and reasons for wishing to serve. If an election is not called this will be filled via co-option.

To qualify, a person must be a British subject or citizen of the Irish Republic, over 18 years of age and an elector, must reside within the parish of Euxton, or within 3 miles of it, or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor (details from the Clerk).

Further details of eligibility, procedures of a vacancy, guidance of being a Parish Councillor for Euxton are all available on request from the Clerk or linked on the Council's website to the vacancy notice.

All Weather play space for Greenside

The delay in the creation of this space was due to the building of the houses on Waterside, as a main drain link needed constructing under the area the play space was to be built.

The drain, and the houses, are all completed now and the Council has grant applications ready for submission towards the cost of this very large ambitious project.

The play space will feature sports of basket ball, net ball, football and other ball sports and it has been requested in the designs for other activities to be included.

The tenders for the supply and build of this project are due in by the end of the year, so they can be considered in January.

If the tenders are suitable and a choice can be made in the new year then the planning process will be updated with the new design and it is the aspiration of the Council that this will be constructed in the Summer of 2023.

County Councillor Aidy Riggott commented on the scheme and Euxton library's involvement,

"I am proud of the team at Euxton Library who have stepped up and supported this Lancashire County Council initiative.

In the library we are offering a warm and welcome space for anyone who wants to come along. We know we cannot solve all of the problems on our own, but we will continue to work with partners to ensure we are doing as much as possible to support our residents."

Money saving tips for this Winter

Have a read through these few suggestions - if you adopt only a couple of these you will be saving money. Challenge yourself to adopt 5 of these tips in the next 5 weeks!

Around the home:

Swap out old bulbs for new LED bulbs which save electricity

Switch off items in 'standby' mode eg. TVs etc

Unplug charger plugs when not charging

Switch plugs off at the wall on items not in use

Assess if it would be better to be on a water meter, fix water leaks

Always fill your dishwasher, and washer, before putting on

Only boil as much water as you need in the kettle

Don't go to the shops without a list, stop shopping with your eyes or on impulse - don't go shopping hungry either!

Plan meals for the week and write items on a shopping list

Waste NO food, use it up, stock check before shopping

Shop alternative brands, compare prices before picking up your normal items

Research money saving recipes

Layer more clothes rather than turning up the heating

If you are very cold visit a 'warm and welcome' space

Try to use the car less for very short journeys, walk more

Car share to the same place eg. weekly supermarket shop with

Initiatives to help cut back:

Have a NO SPEND day

Have a NO TAKEAWAY day (or month!)

Have a wardrobe sort and 'dare to wear again' something you found rather than buy more

Get the most out of products, bottles, tubes etc

Cut out any subscriptions or memberships you don't use eg like Satellite, Gyms, magazines

Check your bank statements for old payments which should have been cancelled

Interest rates have risen - check you are in the correct account at your bank and move any savings for more interest

Know where your money goes - so you know what you have to spend - write it out in a list, all incomes and outgoings - set yourself goals

Try something new

Change your habits to limit spending, when your bored don't go to the shops, take a walk or visit someone, or meet up in a warm space

Try visiting a charity shop for what your looking for, before just ordering new

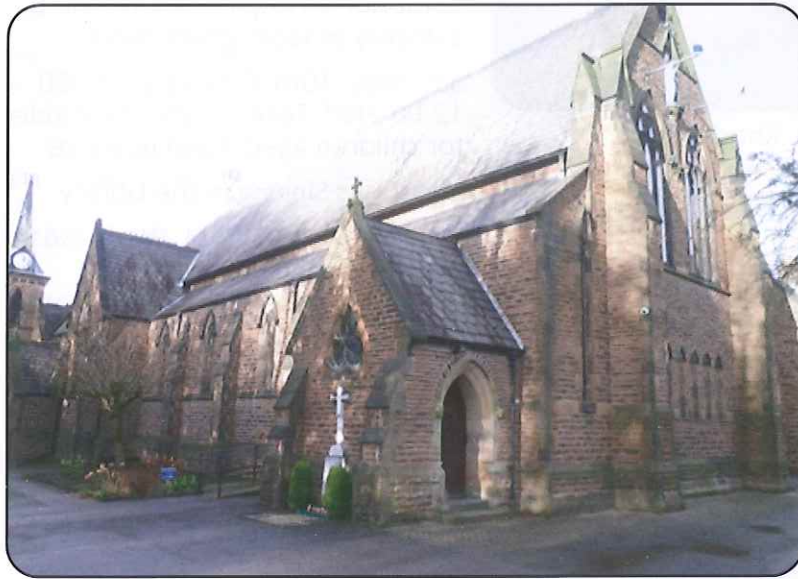
