Councillor Vacancy -

Euxton Buckshaw Ward



Presently there is a vacancy for a Parish Councillor on the Council.

Applications are invited and any person wishing to serve as a Councillor should write to the Clerk giving details of interests, experience and reasons for wishing to serve. If an election is not called this will be filled via co-option.

To qualify, a person must be a British subject or citizen of the Irish Republic, over 18 years of age and an elector, must reside within the parish of Euxton, or within 3 miles of it, or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor (details from the Clerk).

Further details of eligibility, procedures of a vacancy, guidance of being a Parish Councillor for Euxton are all available on request from the Clerk or linked on the Council's website to the vacancy notice.

Primrose Play area re-vamp

Council asked in the last newsletter for ideas of what people would like to see in the Primrose Hill Play area.



This is one artists impression of what we could fit in the area, leaving in three pieces of equipments which are relatively new, nearest the entrance - the double swing unit, net cone and roundabout.

This view shows 8 new pieces of equipment from a large coco wave swing, a track rider attached to a multi climb unit, blazer in the centre, carousel, springy, climbing unit and a smaller childs multi climb unit.

Council will be calling out for tender quotations for similar schemes then we will post these on display boards, on site, as we did for other play areas, so users can vote on options.

It is hoped a scheme can be delivered in Spring 2024.


Defibrillators now up and running

Path resurrections

Euxton Council has been campaigning for a number of years for the 'once' loved and popular Euxton section of the Yarrow Valley walk route to be improved and brought back to life.

Well, it is finally happening...


Many years ago (over 25) Chorley Council marked out and built the path routes in partnership with the local land owner, but since then it had rotted and fallen away leaving parts of the route quite treacherous.

Euxton Council had included the route in many requests of Chorley Council to improve and rebuild some path sections and this important, once very popular route, is now getting the 'tlc' it deserves.

Members of Euxton Council and Chorley officers walked the route in late 2022 to plan and scope for the work and agreement reached between Chorley and Euxton Councils for the paths renovations and then its ongoing future.

Work began in 2023 doing the path in sections depending on the weather and being able to get materials across the farmed land. A further site walk was done in October 2023 to finalise the last parts of the project which need completing.


The photos from the October walk are here to show some of the major works, but there are many other parts done either by Chorley rangers or the land owner to improve sections. By Spring it is hoped all the elements will be completed along the route and we can update in the next newsletter.

Our school is beginning an exciting new chapter in its future development. We are forming a multi-academy trust (MAT) with Parklands High School and Highfield Community Primary School. This will mean increased opportunities for collaboration and sharing resources.

A great bonus for current and prospective parents is that Balshaw Lane Primary children will now have higher priority admission to Parklands (if parents wish for it). Our pupils will have priority above the 'distance from school' criteria which is usually the cut-off point for admissions to Parklands.

Parents would still be able to choose other high schools but, for many families, this admissions change is really welcomed.

To the local community and families, there will not be any noticeable changes about our school, when we form the MAT. We will still have the same school name, uniform and our usual fantastic staff. It will be a very positive move to improve transition to high school.

We've had a very busy and engaging autumn term so far with our second Science Space Week; author visits and faith visits. We always like to make our curriculum vibrant and engaging with opportunities for enrichment.

We were thrilled when we were awarded the Green Flag Award for all our eco work. Part of our work includes our eco challenge garden which is currently in development. We won a competition run by Euxton Parish Council to gain £5000 funding for the project. This was an amazing and very generous donation by the parish council - we are extremely grateful for this.

At the time of writing, we are looking forward to Christmas events. A highlight is always our Senior Citizens' Christmas Party when guests can enjoy the children's performance, some festive refreshments and, of course, good company. Balshaw Lane's project - "The children of Balshaw Lane wish to create a teaching and learning garden, which will provide them with a challenging, exciting and creative way to learn. Since amending our school motto to 'Be the Change' the children have fostered the feeling of individual passion and responsibility for our world and wish to display this through an amazing and inspiring garden."

Euxton Primrose Hill Primary School Awarded Prestigious Apple Distinguished School Status

Euxton Primrose Hill Primary School are committed to ensuring that its pupils receive the very best possible education and believe that access to the very latest technology is an essential component in securing this. As a school, it has been on a ten-year journey with Apple technology and have now been awarded Apple Distinguished School status. A prestigious award held only by 728 schools worldwide.

When headteacher Gareth Counce first joined Primrose Hill, the school had 18 PCs in shared areas around the school. He knew the school needed a digital transformation to ensure that the education remained the very best possible and to build on the teaching and learning already happening. Gareth and the governors put a 5-year plan into place to invest and implement technology, and specifically iPads into classes, ensuring all teachers had a device and pupils the access to a shared iPad.

Teachers and pupils quickly adapted to using iPad technology and the benefits for teaching and learning in the classroom environment became clear. They were able to use new technology and apps to bring learning to life and really engage and enthuse the pupils. Six years ago, the decision was made to invest in 1:1 iPads in their Upper Key Stage Two classes, enabling teachers to innovate and redefine learning for these pupils.

In 2018, the school entered the BT Tech Factor Competition, with Upper Key Stage 2 pupils creating a video application, stating how they would like school to use the prize money to invest in VR and AR technology if they won. The school was successful and used the competition money to invest in VR headsets, Augmented reality workbooks and t-shirts. The pupils now have opportunities to visit anywhere in the world, go back into the past and see inside the human body all without leaving the classroom!

To get the most out of all this new technology, all staff and even the pupil digital leaders took part in training in the use of specific apps and earned their Apple Teacher Badges. The school has also invested significantly into training for staff, with support from an Apple Professional Learning Specialist, to maximise the iPad's potential and keep up to date with ever evolving technology.

Due to this success of the 1:1 device approach in Upper Key Stage 2, three years later the school made the decision to run the 1:1 scheme across all Key Stage 2 classes and continue with 1:2 devices in all other classes. All iPads are leased by the school so staff and pupils always has the most up-to-date devices.

Technology allows pupils to explore new ideas, work collaboratively, break down barriers and share their work globally. By equipping pupils with the skills needed to use technology effectively, the school is giving them the best chance of success. Euxton Primrose Hill are proud to offer an ambitious curriculum that incorporates the very best available technology, challenges and inspires our pupils. The school motto states, 'Together we will make a difference', and the school is doing exactly that as a beacon school of technological and educational excellence, supporting many schools on their computing journey.



Primrose Hill's entry - is to create a living wall on the front of school, the wall the children and Chair, Cllr Katrina Reed and Cllr Neil Hall are stood by presenting the grant cheque of £1,200 for the eco group to create their project which is:

"To attract more wildlife (like insects) to our school by creating habitats for bees and butterflies, the more plants you have the cleaner the air, to improve people's wellbeing and to improve the appearance of the school."

Katrina said, "Well done to both projects I'm looking forward to seeing them completed next year."

2022 was a consolidation year and Euxton finished mid table.


2023 Euxton won the Premiership, in fact they knew they could not be beaten with three matches remaining to be played and eventually ended up with 47 points more than the team in second place (12 points maximum per match).

This great result not only meant the presentation of the fantastic shield in the photo but promotion into The Northern Premier League, an ECB Premier League, where they will join the likes of Chorley and Leyland.

3rd Prison Site - what it means to Euxton!

Just appraising you of recent communications with the Secretary of State (DLuHC), the Planning Inspectorate about the Re-opened Inquiry.

The Secretary of State and the Planning Inspectorate had stated the Inquiry will be extended from 4 days to 8 days.



It will still only cover road safety issues, but the extension is supposedly to allow for consideration of "Any material change in circumstances, fact or policy that may have arisen since the previous inquiry".

We have liaised directly with Chorley Council and the Appellant (MoJ); neither of which, have any further evidence to add to that they have already submitted.

So this seemed an odd intervention, if no additional material changes have arisen!

The Inquiry is now officially due to reopen on the 25th March 2024. We are awaiting a rebuttal of our evidence, the deadline for which is the 16th November 2023.

We remain confident in our evidential stance, as do our legal team and transport consultant.

We will keep you posted of any responses and what this means for our continued opposition.





