The removal then installation of all the new items should take about two weeks so the new area is planned to be open for action again in October, or sooner if the weather is kind to the contractors.



# **Euxton Councillor Vacancies**

Presently there are two vacancies for Parish Councillors on Euxton Council.

Applications are invited and any person wishing to serve as a Councillor should write to the Clerk giving details of interests, experience and reasons for wishing to serve. If an election is not called this will be filled via co-option.

To qualify, a person must be a British subject or citizen of the Irish Republic, over 18 years of age and an elector, must reside within the parish of Euxton, or within 3 miles of it, or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor (details from the Clerk).

Further details of eligibility, procedures of a vacancy, guidance of being a Parish Councillor for Euxton are all available on request from the Clerk or linked on the Council's website to the vacancy notice.

# **Southport Road**

Euxton Council has an opportunity to create a new recreation area on land which currently is under utilised in the South of the village.

A much needed facility in Euxton South is an all-weather games area similar to the one Council provided in the North of the village at Greenside last year.

With Community Infra-structure Levy (CIL) monies it could be possible to provide such a facility along with accompanying items such as shelter, seating and activity based equipment for the teen and above age range.

A few images of products being looked into are shown on the right, but Council wants to **gather your input**, feedback or suggestions for activity based equipment - let us know or send a picture if you have seen a product or used a piece of equipment you feel might be good to have in Euxton.

When scheme views have been worked up they will be shown in the newsletter and on site to gather opinions and feedback before progressing, if planning permission is required.

### New roundabout deer!

The idea was thought of to strengthen the local identity and provide a new low growing plant design. The placement of the deer was suggested by Euxton Parish Council as deer are often seen around Buckshaw??


100 Photinia Red Robins and 100 emerald and gold Euonymus Fortunil have also been planted on the roundabout after it had been cleared of higher planting.

The lower planting will aid visibility, when crossing the roundabout, the previous planting was obscuring the view of cars on the roundabout previously.

Euxton Council has a wicker canon on one of the roundabouts, now referred to as the 'Canon' roundabout - this one the 'Deer' roundabout so what's in store for the roundabout in the middle?

Well that is the next project and all we can say at this time is 'blue flower'!!

# Shopmobility in Chorley

On a blustery, but mainly fine, 7th June Chorley and South Ribble Shopmobility celebrated the National Shopmobility Awareness Day.

Chorley's Deputy Mayor and Mayoress, Allistair and Jane Morwood proved very enthusiastic in their support, donating some hanging baskets for the unit and joining in the scooter manoeuvring over a mini "test track". They left vowing to return as Mayor and Mayoress next year.

The Awareness day gave Chorley Shopmobility an opportunity to showcase its service to help people access town centre shops and facilities through new equipment bought this year with the help of the National Lottery, WO Street Foundation, County, Borough and Parish Councils. Many of the sponsors attended during the day including Councillor Joan Williamson who used the test tack to try out the mobility scooter funded by a grant from Euxton Parish Council, along with Council Barrie Williamson.

Thank you for Euxton Parish Council's grant of £1,000 towards the new equipment.

Euxton Council has continued to upgrade its signage around the village with the same design already seen along the roads.

This is the new replacement sign just off the roundabout on Southport Road leading on to Balshaw Lane.

There are three more to go up, two with flower beds, near the former Railway pub thanks to Nature Trail Nursery, Shaw Green and sign at Pincock Bridge.



# App success!

The Love Clean Streets app continues to show successes with residents reporting all highway faults such as; potholes, streetlights out, flooding, blocked drain, footway problems.

Here are a couple of recent ones noticed, from reporting to action.

Hedgerow overgrown near Shaw Green - reported through the app by the Clerk from a residents email then followed up by Euxton's village caretakers with a sweep and pavement weed to make it look totally refreshed.

The App is simple to use and your issue can be logged in seconds. Reports go directly to Lancashire highways team but you will be able to report issues onthe-go on your mobile whilst you're out and about.

You will also be able to keep up to date on progress of your report via the app.



#### **Euxton Parish Church Take On Ironman 70.3 Bolton**

Last Sunday (30 June), over 1600 athletes took part in the Ironman 70.3 Bolton event; these included a team from Euxton Parish Church who competed in the event as a relay team, achieving 3rd place in the Relay Teams Women category. With a fundraising target of £2,500 in the form of sponsorship, the team embarked on the difficult challenge to raise much needed funds for their church.

The Ironman competition is a familiar event to this church community, as their vicar, Rev Jo Smith, has been an Ironman chaplain since 2016, supporting numerous events across the country. The Euxton Parish Church relay team comprised of Rev Amy Bland (the curate at Euxton), Becky Edge and Beth Palmer (both also school governors of Euxton CE Primary School).

Starting at 6.15am, Amy swam a 1.2 mile lap of Pennington Flash before handing over the timing chip to Becky, who proceeded to cycle the 56 mile route around the villages local to the lake then 2 loops around Bolton and Horwich. Beth completed the event, running a 13.1 mile route around Bolton Town Centre, with the team culminating the competition with a 100 metre run together down the red carpet to the finish at Bolton Town Hall, where they were presented with their medals by Rev Jo Smith. The atmosphere was electric as crowds gathered in their thousands to support all the athletes, and the team all agreed the local support spurred them on, with a couple of personal records even being achieved!

Completing the full event in 5 hours 44 minutes, the team proudly took 3rd place in their category, and received their trophies at Bolton Town Hall that evening. This was the first time any of the team had participated in such a big endurance event which made it all the more exciting, with the result proving all the months of hard training was worthwhile, and the team agreeing with Ironman's slogan - Anything is possible! (Especially with God's help.)

The amazingly supportive local church community, family and friends have all supported the team both personally and in their fundraising endeavours over the past few months. Donations received currently total just over £2,200; just a few hundred pounds short of their £2,500 target.

Rev. Jo Smith said: "This has been an incredible effort from within our church family to raise funds for Euxton Parish Church, the money raised will enable us to do more to share the love of Jesus with our community and beyond".


