




Chairman's Column

Euxton WEB Issues

The Euxton WEB newsletter hits a milestone of issues, with this one being the 100th issue.

When I first starting working for Euxton Council in 1999 there was a budget line for a newsletter and a will to communicate regularly with the residents of the village.

I offered to help create a template and investigate how to get one distributed and Issue 1 was distributed in May 2000. We did one more issue that year then 4 issues each year since - not missing one issue.

The front page article of that first issue was an account of the digging up of the Stocks from the top of Bank Lane where the land was due to be built on.

Chorley Historical & Archaeological Society (CHAS) were on hand to advise and were helped by our Lengthsman the Stan Bentham, former Cllrs Simon Wellerd and the late John Matson.

with new woods and installed on the Millennium Green where they are today.

Since the earlier issues, which were black and white, Council upgraded the newsletter to colour and it is now regularly 8 pages or more.

7000 copies of the WEB are printed each guarter and over 6000 copies are hand delivered through letterboxes in Euxton and Euxton Buckshaw, more rural homes go out by royal mail and some delivered by volunteers. Council still feels it is essential to report to residents the work of the Council through a newsletter.

Hedgehogs

Peter Joinson and his mum Emma have been volunteering at Leyland Hedgehog Rescue since September 2024 and since doing so, have realised just how endangered these gorgeous mammals are and wanted to help them as much as possible.

Despite their small size, hedgehogs can travel up to 3kms and visit up to 13 gardens per night through well-connected habitats. However, whilst there are known benefits to connecting two or three gardens, it's not enough. Green spaces need to be joined up across neighbourhoods for all hedgehogs to access the varied resources they need to survive so Peter came up with an idea for his own community project to encourage residents and businesses to join together to help hogs.

One of Peter's goals is to create as many residences within Buckshaw Village with 'Hedgehog Highways' in their fences as possible. Removing barriers to a hedgehog's nightly wandering is the most important action we can take for the species. These CD sized holes in garden fences and gates benefit the hedgehogs by allowing them into otherwise inaccessible gardens, reducing the distance hedgehogs must travel to forage for food, reducing the number of road crossings hedgehogs need to make and they help hedgehogs find a mate, make nests, and have their young.

Peter and Emma held an open day on Sunday 23rd March at the Lancaster Way Community Centre on Buckshaw Village to promote their project and as a result raised over £260 for Leyland Hedgehog Rescue. In addition, 12 local residents signed up for hedgehog highways to be installed in their gardens by a local handyman working together with them to complete this work for free.

Since establishing their project Peter and Emma have worked alongside Chorley Hedgehog Rescue's site release coordinator Adrienne Talbot which has resulted, to date, in four new local locations being approved for rehabilitated hedgehogs in the care of Chorley Hedgehog Rescue to be released on. What is a Hedgehog Highway?

A Hedgehog Highway is a 5 inch gap in a fence or wall allowing access for Hedgehogs to come and go. The surround can be attached around the hole to raise awareness to the highway and encourage others to have highways.

These gaps and highways are essential in the battle to prevent the extinction of our endangered spiky friends.

The Hedgehog Highway allows hedgehogs:

forage for food

access nesting sites


meet mates to breed

Please also take a moment before starting any gardening work this Spring to consider if there may be a hedgehog in your garden. Check undergrowth before strimming, check sheds before dismantling and if you do have a hedgehog visitor, please consider support feeding with a daily bowl of fresh water and some kitten biscuits.



Councillor Vacancy



Applications are invited and any person wishing to serve as a Councillor should write to the Clerk giving details of interests, experience and reasons for wishing to serve. If an election is not called this will be filled via co-option.

To qualify, a person must be a British subject or citizen of the Irish Republic, over 18 years of age and an elector, must reside within the parish of Euxton, or within 3 miles of it, or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor (details from the Clerk).

Further details of eligibility, procedures of a vacancy, guidance of being a Parish Councillor for Euxton are all available on request from the Clerk or linked on the Council's website to the vacancy notice.

Canary Girls!

Buckshaw Village is built on the historic site of the former Royal Ordnance Factory (ROF) Chorley, which played a crucial role during World War II. The factory was staffed by many conscripted women, known as "Canary Girls," whose skin turned yellow due to exposure to dangerous chemicals. These women faced significant health risks but made vital contributions to the war effort.

Despite their sacrifices, there is no dedicated memorial to honour the "Canary Girls" at the National Memorial Arboretum, unlike other conscripted workers such as the Land Girls. Buckshaw Village Women's Institute (WI) is working to change this by raising awareness and establishing a permanent memorial within Buckshaw Village to commemorate these women. They aim to educate future generations about the and challenging dangerous undertaken by conscripted women across all ROF sites during the WWII.

The initiative is about acknowledging the past and ensuring that the contributions of these remarkable women are finally given the recognition they deserve. Buckshaw Village WI invites the community to join them in remembering the "Canary Girls" of ROF Chorley.

Furthermore, the Group intends to honour these women by laying wreaths of yellow poppies on local war memorials on Remembrance Day later this year.





Euxton WI

In March three teams represented us at the Federation Quiz, unfortunately devilishly difficult so no trophies this year!

In April a previous speaker, Brian Topping, returned to tell more amusing stories from his life as a Custom Officer. We didn't invite a speaker in May but held a Social Afternoon when, as well as enjoying tea, cake and chat, member Freda Jenkins shared the history of Euxton WI's role during WW2, a fitting tribute for the VE Day Commemoration.

I wonder how many people in Euxton remember that, in 1941, as part of the War effort, the WI members aimed to raise at least £50, the cost of a Bren gun. They actually raised £366 and 18 shillings (in 'old' money), the price of a heavy Machine Gun and two rifles - unfortunately there isn't a record of how such a huge sum was raised.

On 8th May, as part of the VE Day Commemorations in Chorley this year, the Theatre provided a 1940's themed buffet and showed 'A Matter of Life or Death' a film with David Niven and Kim Hunter. A group of us went along and then walked across to the War Memorial in Astley Park for the ceremonial lighting of the Beacon.

The Spring Lunch held on 21st May took the theme of red, white and blue and the hall was decked out with bunting and flags. As always, the Catering Crew did us proud, the food was excellent and a good time was had by all.

The two outings planned for the Spring were both successful; the play 'Spitfire Girls' at Shakespeare North was well received and the second tour of Pendle Witches country was as successful as the first.
