

Remembrance time

The period of remembrance was different this year. As we could not have gatherings, the wreaths were laid separately by Councillors and residents.

The Chair of the Council Katrina Reed and County Councillor Aidy Riggott laid their wreaths early so residents visiting the memorial at Buckshaw Community Centre and Euxton War Memorial would see them there.

This year Council erected, thanks to the All Purposes Committee, additional flag poles around the village. These are for another project but we have utilised for this Remembrance time. Thanks to the Village Caretakers for fixing them in and to Debra and Alan for putting up the flags.

New flag locations are: Runshaw shops, Buckshaw Village Community Centre, Balshaw Villa Garden, Highways shops and the already present Euxton War Memorial.



YOUR SPEED

Solar powered Speed Indicators

The All Purposes Committee has ordered four, permanently located solar speed indicator devices for the village.

The portable device we have presently is now over 10 years old and the Committee has been looking for a replacement.

The solar powered devices don't need to be taken down and recharged as they have a solar panel attached which does this work for us.

The locations for the devices must be passed and approved by Lancashire County Highways (LCC), as they will be installed by the road side. The positions requested are:

Southport Road in to the village westbound, near to the skate park entrance;

Euxton Lane westbound in to the village where it drops from 40mph to 30mph;

Wigan Road A49 northbound entering the village where it has dropped from 60 to 40 to 30mph near to the Methodist Church; and.

Runshaw Lane westbound from the Bay Horse lights towards the shops, adjacent to the Library.

When LCC approves its preferred exact positions the units will be installed.

Nature & Recycling go hand in hand

Committee working

Euxton Parish Council meets 10 times in the year, normally, which 2020 has not been. The whole Council meets every month except August and December.


It also operates through Committees, and Councillors choose and serve on any or all of the Committees, of which there are presently 4 standing committees as follows:

Leisure Committee - deals with 'leisure' items such as play areas, Millennium Green, skate park, sourcing new items such as the Bowling Green, which for a time was a Committee of its own because of the amount of work creating a Bowling Green from scratch would take.

All Purposes Committee - looks after gardening and planting around the village, machines such as the vacuum and the speed indicator devices, seats and noticeboards, grants, Christmas, Gala attendance and many other subjects.

Personnel Committee looks after the employed staff of the Council and all associated matters.

Allotment Committee has been planning and developing the allotment site off Euxton Lane and will continue following the creation and occupation of the site with plot holders and become the committe responsible for the site.

Many of you will, over the years, have come into Euxton Parish Church - whether for services, Christmas or Easter celebrations or for family events such as baptisms, weddings or funerals. (If you've never been in then know that you are very welcome).


In recent years, it has become increasingly evident that our beautiful 17th century church roof is leaking with copious amounts of water coming through. During lockdown, we have removed the plaster from the arch inside church, but we still need to repair the roof and stop the water coming in. We have been advised that we need to act quickly so that the situation doesn't get any worse (especially with winter approaching).

We have been informed that estimated costs may be in the region of £220,000!!! This was a devastating blow. As you will appreciate this is an absolutely huge amount to raise, especially in the current climate. However, we are keen to address the building as soon as possible. We want our church to continue to be a place of worship for our community not just for current generations, but for generations to come.

Over the coming months there will be a number of fundraising events, all the details are on our website www.euxtonparishchurch.org and our Facebook page (@euxtonchurch). These will include an online auction of promises, a virtual Christmas fair and some surprises for 2021. We would love to see our community embrace these events as part of our roof appeal. Euxton's Allotment Site

It's been many months now since Euxton Parish Council (EPC) asked its residents who might be interested in having an allotment plot. You might be wondering just where are we now?

The Council has been working hard via many zoom meetings during the Covid pandemic to try and progress this project to a point where we could reveal our plans.

We have now reached that point and attached with this report is the plan of what we think will be the best allotment facility in the area. See over on page 5.

We have tried to consider all eventualities and have included many of the resident's suggestions within the plan. All allotments will come fenced with a shed, hard standing and 200L water butt to reclaim rain water. The whole area will also have a 2m security fence and car parking for 20 cars approx. There will be smaller more manageable plots available for the disabled and possibly a "Men in Sheds" project, which was an initiative set up by Age UK.

At the time of writing this report we the planning are preparing application and selecting contractors with a view to starting the groundwork's in spring of 2021.We would like the allotment holders to be fully engaged in the future running and management of these allotments and it is hoped that an Allotment Society can be set up with all the allotment holders. Keep your eyes on the village notice boards where more information will be posted.

It is hoped the fund will launch after the Council's November Council meeting, at which the criteria will be set.



Local Businesses in Euxton - Use them or lose them!

In an attempt to support our local shops and businesses in Euxton we are featuring some in this newsletter and hope more of our businesses will input to be featured in future newsletters.

Some local establishments have been generous and inventive during this pandemic period by changing their working practices, opening different hours, adapting to takeaway orders, making deliveries, offering free food over school holidays, supplying local people with essentials when they couldn't get out or needed help - we should all bear this in mind and support our local shops as we need them to stick around. Here are only a few of our great shops and retailers.

During this difficult time for retail and because of the pandemic, we had two brand new shops open in one of our parades - The former Glovers Bakery, closed down just before the first lockdown. The shop was revamped and reincarnated into Euxton Deli which serves freshly made sandwiches, pies and all you might want for lunch. Stef says "Welcome to the new Euxton Deli. Come and see us for a chat with friends over a hot coffee, a delicious sandwich or even a hearty breakfast. Start your day the right way and our bubbly staff are always here to help. See you soon!!"

During first lockdown the once YMCA charity shop closed and now has been completely made over into Euxton Barber.









They opened soon after the first lockdown and were doing very well - with rave reviews on Facebook from Euxton residents. Presently they have had to close in second lockdown but with all our help we can make its re-opening a busy success with all your support.

During the lockdowns our take-away food establishments throughout the village remained open along with the life-line shops such as Spar, Nisa, Premier and Rowlands Chemist.

The Talbot pub on Balshaw Lane re-opened again in mid July after keeping residents entertained during their lockdown with an online quiz. They adapted to serve pizzas in late October but still had to succumb to the second lockdown closing early November.

During their brief Summer opening they packed in entertainment inside and outside from quiz nights competitions, live sport and offers.

During the second lockdown they opened a food bank collection point on the car park in an inflatable tent and sending donations to the LW Storehouse - Chorley Food Bank - they report, "we are just so overwhelmed with everyone's generosity!!"
