### **Chairman's Column**

Hello to you all and welcome to the first issue of the Euxton Web of 2015, as our Clerk has noted the 60th issue to be published.

At the January meeting a new Parish Councillor was co-opted, Mr Terry Cook, after the resignation of Mr Keith Wallbank and at the February meeting we hope to have another

new Parish Councillor co-opted onto the Council to replace Mr Barry Mason who resigned in early December.

During January myself and the Vice Chair Cllr John Bamber have attended several of the initial consultations regarding the expansion of both Primrose Hill Primary School and Buckshaw Trinity Primary School, our understanding was if every thing goes ahead as planned a new intake of 60 Reception Class pupils at Primrose Hill and a 90 pupil Reception Class at Buckshaw Trinity would start in September 2015, whilst building work commences.

The other consultations were regarding a new supermarket being built on Buckshaw together with a second Community Centre. The planning application for the supermarket is in the pipe line at present. No doubt more will be known on all these developments by the next Euxton Web issue.

In February Councillors enjoyed visiting the National Libraries Day event held at our own Euxton Library, see photo below, where we met and chatted to residents about our new questionnaire, which is in this issue on page 5.

Again an open invitation to all Residents to attend any of our Parish Council or Committee Meetings to discuss any topics regarding Euxton, we look forward to seeing you.

### 6th year fall for Euxton

Hello to you all and welcome to the In January Euxton Council confirmed its budget for the first issue of the Euxton Web of 2015, next financial year of 2015/2016.

For the 6th consecutive year, the element paid by Euxton residents for the Parish Council has reduced, and this year will be just £27 (for an average band D property).

This is just under 52p per week per household for all the Parish Council services.

This year the Council has precepted monies for new and ongoing projects.

New, such as the Balshaw Lane Ponds project. This was introduced to you in the last newsletter by Cllr Thornhill. Projects already planned in, such as the replacement of the Toddler equipment on the Balshaw Lane play area, the Council has increased the budget for.

There are other new budgets included in the next financial year such as a Heritage budget, a Communications heading for projects to increase public involvement in the Council's work. Also a budget for a new redesigned website and possibly adding social media to our methods of communication.

### **Toddler Park re-fit**

The Toddler Park side of the Play Area off Balshaw Lane (on the right from the road) is due to be re-fitted in the Summer.

The Council has allocated more funds to the project as the cost of removal of the old equipment is quite high and there would not have been many new items if the budget was not increased.

There is now enough in the budget to remove all the old equipment, except two items which were only fitted a few years ago, the springy and roundabout which will be moved on the site.

The new equipment will be chosen for the toddler age group up to early years, then the children normally move on to the activity equipment on the other side of the site.

There will be a period when the site will be out of action and closed, so please bear with us. When completed it should look much better and offer some new and interesting items for the younger children.

The skip will be available for people to get rid of bulky household waste, no paint or tyres.






### **An Illuminating Talk**

At Euxton Library.... Gordon Medlicott -On Thursday 4th December we invited Gordon Medlicott to speak at our Monthly Coffee morning. This was very well attended by members of the local community.

Gordon lives in Wigan and was a Lighthouse Keeper for over 32 years and serviced 22 lighthouses. The industry went through massive changes before he was finally made redundant in 1998 when automation took over

His story began in 1966 - a time when oil lights were rotated by hand-wound clockwork mechanism and keepers handled explosive fog signals. travelled extensively around the coasts of England, Wales and the Channel Islands. His 22 postings varied from offshore lighthouses, such as the famous Needles Rock at the Isle of Wight, where the men were confined to just a handful of tiny rooms and often spent hours in the dark to those located on beautiful islands such as Lundy in the Bristol Channel where the accommodation was more spacious. Life in the offshore lighthouses was very basic - no running water, heating or working toilets!

Gordon was awarded a medal from the Royal Humane Society for his involvement in a rescue. He was manning the South Stack in Anglesey where two young boys came to him for help. Their climbing instructor had fallen down a cliff face.



The Association of Lighthouse Keepers asked him to write a research document on completion this was snapped up by and publisher entitled Illuminating Experience".

Most of Gordon's "retirement" is spent doing after-dinner speeches and talks at schools and WI meetings. He is retiring "completely" at the end of this year after 30 years.

A big thank you to Gordon and to Euxton Parish Council for their donation towards Gordon's fee.

### **Euxton War Memorial Group**

At the time of going to print plans had been made for the foundations of Euxton War Memorial to be constructed.

A detachment of the Royal Engineers will be on site outside Euxton Community Centre to begin clearing the ground and excavating prior to installing the reinforced concrete foundations. Simultaneously, another detachment of the Engineers were transporting tonnes of Portland Stone to the stonemasons yard in Lancashire. The stone will then be worked and prepared so that the stonemason can erect the memorial in pieces like a large jig-saw puzzle.

A roll of honour of 50 casualties from 1914 to the present day has been approved and is already in the final proof reading stages with the stonemason. The memorial will consist of three plagues which will list the casualties of World War One, World War Two and Other Conflicts.

A final fundraiser for Euxton War Memorial has been arranged. A Race Night at Euxton War Memorial Institute will be held on Friday 27th March at 7pm. Tickets are just £1 each. Any enquiries please call Sue Balshaw on 07825368672.

eggs and the Pickled Eggs and we came 1st 2nd and 3rd so well done to all concerned.


We celebrate our 93rd Birthday at our March meeting and as National WI celebrate 100 years in June, we are not too far behind!


