Welcome to the March 2022 issue of the 'Euxton Web' which details both news and events in and around Euxton.

I know that it is some time since Christmas but the Carol singing round the Christmas Tree was very well attended. Thank you all the residents to

turning up on a non too pleasant evening, and also thanks to the Councillors and the Clerks for their help with serving the mince Pies, sweets and mulled wine.

At our January Meeting the Council set the budgets and the precept for 2022/2023 . The Leisure Committee and the All Purposes Committee also after their recent meetings have several projects in the pipeline for 2022/2023 and 2023/2024. These include work on the Millennium Green, updating a section of Balshaw Lane Play Area, the allweather area on Greenside and an Eco Project for the pupils at Junior Schools. Preparations for celebrating the Platinum Jubilee are also well under way.

During last year the Council offered Eco grants to the Junior Schools, the Headteachers completed their proposal forms and photographs of how they decided to spend the money are inside on page 5.

The planting of the trees on Runshaw and Euxton Lanes were finally completed after delay due to Covid lockdowns, also the fruit trees on the School Lane edge of the allotment site have been planted.

Euxton PCSO Ray is to retire at the end of March and we all, residents and the Parish Council, wish him a happy retirement.

The Council has for 6-7 years been considering the necessity of independent office space, this was discussed and voted on at our February Meeting, the outcome being that it will take an office in Euxton. This will enable Parish Councillors to hold meetings with residents, Committee Meetings and of course office space for the staff.

Just a reminder that this is a local election year for the Parish Council, to be held in May.

### Parish portion

In January, Euxton Council agreed its budget for the financial year, 1st April 2022 through to the end of March 2023.

Still less than £3 per month for all the Parish

The Parish Council tax element for an average band D household will be £35.46, this is an increase on Council services last year by just 94p for the year.

Council will continue with any ongoing projects, such as planting and looking after the flower displays, eco projects, maintaining its own play area and recreations sites, keeping the village litter picked and swept.



### **Four Year Elections**

Parish Councillors are elected on a four year cycle. This year all 18 of the Euxton Parish Council seats are up for election, as its last election was in May 2019.

# Thursday, 5th May 2022

With Euxton Council being a larger Council, the whole village is split into three wards, each containing seats. Following the Borough Boundary review finalised in March 2019, Euxton's three wards have been divided differently.



Euxton will still have three wards but they will have new names and quantities of Parish Councillor seats within them. See the map which shows where the ward boundaries fall.

Euxton's wards are:

Euxton Buckshaw Village with 5 Parish Councillor seats
Euxton North & East with 11 Parish Councillor seats
Euxton South with 2 Parish Councillor seats

#### How to apply

The elections are administered by Chorley Council. Nomination papers are available from the Elections Officer at Chorley Council from w/c 7th March 2022 and will need to be completed and submitted back to the Elections Officer before the deadline of 4pm Tuesday, 5th April 2022.

Please note that, the Parish Council Clerk does not have election packs and cannot accept completed packs in - elections are run by Chorley Council.

#### What is a Parish Councillor

Councillors are members of the Parish Council, whether elected or co-opted. They are volunteers and, as such, receive no payment. They give their time freely to attend meetings. There are 10 programmed full council meetings and a number of Committee's with meetings, which its members attend. There is a wealth of information on the website.

# What exactly is a Parish Council

A local council is a corporate body with perpetual succession, and a name" composed of a chairman and councillors. The number of councillors is fixed by the district council and in England must not be less than 5. Euxton has 18 seats.

As a corporate body the council is a an entity and is distinct from its members (either as individuals or collectively) and its' lawful acts, assets and liabilities are its own and not those of its members.

The Parish Council's funds mainly come from the local element of residents' Council Tax bills.

#### To qualify to be a Councillor

To qualify, a person must be a British subject or citizen of the Irish Republic, over 18 years of age and an elector, must reside within the parish of Euxton, or within 3 miles of it, or occupy as owner or tenant any land or premises therein, or have their principal or only place of work there, and must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor.

# Tree planting in Euxton

The Parish Council is looking for areas to plant more trees to replace ones which are lost and to help our environment.



On Runshaw Lane the County Council had to take down a tree opposite Boarded Barn Farm, due to disease. The Parish Council was alerted by a resident and gained county permission for 3 trees to be put on the spacious verge.

These three new variagated coloured leaf trees, which will turn different colours at differnt times of the year were planted in February. The trees planted are:

Acer campestre - or Field Maple

Alnus Incana Aurea - alder 'Aurea'

Liquidamber styraciflua - Sweetgum

Another project which the Parish Council has assisted the Borough Neighbourhood Team with is the planting of 11 trees on Euxton Lane. This will be reported on in the next newsletter.

Had an additional toilet added downstairs - which drain does it flush in to? Do you know?


All these little mistakes add up to pollution of our brooks, streams and rivers.

#### **Home Grown Talent**

As the England mens Under 19's prepare for the latter knockout stages of the 2022 World Cup in the West Indies, Euxton Cricket Club are paying particular interest to the tournament.

One of their former junior players Joshua Boyden is opening the bowling for the National team.

Seventeen year old Josh is the leading wicket taker in the competition, which has seen England progress from their group unbeaten and into the semi final having beaten South Africa in the recent quarter final where Josh to two wickets and the final match winning run out.

Josh, who quite literally lives on the boundary of the Euxton ground, played for the Balshaw Lane Club from the age of 7. He consistently played in age groups above his own year and represented the Euxton senior side as a teenager and the Chorley District, the Ribblesdale League, Lancashire North and then the full Lancashire age group sides whilst at Euxton.

The fast bowling left armer followed his elder Brother over the garden fence to play at Euxton and was regularly seen around the Village practicing his bowling whilst shopping with his parents or walking to Parklands High School in Chorley. Josh always had his cricket whites in his Dad's car, so if there was an injury to an older player he would not miss the opportunity to take the field.

As he progressed into the Lancashire Academy in the 2020 intake he moved to Wigan CC in the Liverpool Competition from Euxton and has represented them at first team level. In 2020 he played for the Lancashire 2nd team. Taking his first senior wickets for them on his way to selection at the prestigious Bunbury Festival. This led to full England selection and he has been ever present in the current Under 19's World Cup.

In a sport where players frequently have a background in the private school system and play for more established larger Clubs. Josh has bucked this trend to achieve what he has to date and make his way from Village cricket, via state school, to the International stage.

Good luck Josh all of Euxton is rooting for you, go well.

In 2021 Euxton Parish Council offered to its 5 primary schools (built on 6 sites) an opportunity to access some of the Community Infrastructure Funding (CIL) the Council has received from developments within the village.

The grant criteria was for eco projects, recycling/reusing, nature, health improvement related projects assisting as wide a community benefit as possible.

Four of our schools were in a position to take up this grant and created something they needed:

- Balshaw Lane Primary had renovated and improved access to their natural pond on site
- Euxton CE Primary had built an outdoor gym with 5 pieces of equipment
- Euxton St Mary's had built a daily mile all weather track on the school fields
- Primrose Hill Primary also had built a daily mile all weather track on the school fields



"As a result of the generosity of the ECO grant project from Euxton Parish Council, we now have the use of a pond area within our school grounds. This allows the children many outdoor educational opportunities that will help develop their creativity, problem solving, independence, confidence and more across a range of subjects."


