

The Euxton War Memorial Group officially handed over the Memorial to the Parish Council so its future can be guaranteed to be provided for and maintained by the most local authority to Euxton.

The Parish Council has powers to maintain, repair and add to War Memorials but not a power to provide within its list of functions. When members of the group approached the Council to help create a memorial it was decided that an independent group which could fund raise, register as a charity and ask for support from the council would be the best way forward - and it obviously was - so the group was formed.

The plan for the group was always to design and secure funding to build and deliver the new war memorial but, to hand it over to Euxton Parish Council for it to be secured a safe future.

The Parish Council would like to say, and reiterate all the positive comments it has heard from residents, how proud and grateful we all are to the group members for working so hard, tirelessly over the past few years to provide this wonderful feature.

**Councillor Mark Jarnell**

In 2014 I was successfully elected as a Chorley Borough councillor for the Euxton South Ward and hold the role of Young People's Champion for the council. I am a Community First Responder (CFR) for North West Ambulance Service NHS Trust, providing volunteer support such as CPR, oxygen and urgent care until an ambulance arrives.

I am a member of Buckshaw Village Community Association, providing events and information to the growing community of Buckshaw. I am Chairman of Chorley Fairtrade Group which successful achieved Fairtrade Status for the town of Chorley in January 2015.

#### "Come Up and See Us Sometime"

Mae West didn't quite say 'come up and see us sometime' but that has been our invitation to residents over Summer and we are extending the invitation till the end of the year.

The Parish Councillors' surgeries held in the Euxton Library have been well-received, with residents describing them as "a good thing". Residents have the opportunity to raise any matter they want with Councillors and those items should get some attention.

Over June and July the dominant concern has been the speeding on the 20mph estate roads. It was reported to the Police and their advice is for residents not to wait for any speed enforcement vans but to note the car registration numbers of persistent offenders and report them - anonymously if you wish - direct to the Police (PCSO Ray Chadwick 01257 246225) or via the Parish Council.

Residents wanting to raise other matters are also encouraged to come along to Parish Council meetings (3rd Thur of the month) to raise them in person, but there is no need to do so to get your issue considered.

From now until Dec the following surgeries will be held:

1st Saturdays of each month

10 to 11am - 5 September, 3 October, 7 November, 5 December

2nd Thursdays of each month

3 to 4pm - 10 September, 8 October, 12 November, 10 December

So please even if you just want to meet us and chat, 'come up to the Library and see us sometime'!

## **Euxton War Memorial Group - The Final Chapter**

On July 12 2015, Euxton War Memorial Group in conjunction with Euxton Churches Together proudly presented a new landmark and monument to fellow Euxton residents.



The War Memorial outside of Euxton

Parish Church Community centre was the culmination of five years of passionate determination from a very small group of people.

This group worked tirelessly from day one to find land, fundraise, design, procure and build a monument that is both contemporary and traditional in its materials, its look, clean lines and its meaning.

It may seem like a simple structure to many who bear witness to it, but I can assure that the journey taken by the group wasn't easy, many technical challenges and negotiations to land ownership, post build custodianship, planning permission, material selection, underground surveys, foundations, researching of names, fundraising of monies and many more hurdles faced the group.

It was a journey that was borne out of a deep and painful loss for several of us, which has ended with somewhat of a closure, though the sudden loss of a loved one will always be felt. I am very thankful to everyone in the group who shared this journey and carried it through to the end.

The group owe an enormous debt of gratitude to the many individuals, businesses and organisations who came to us to help and bring the monument to a reality. There are too many to name individually, but they all know who they are, our gratefulness to their contribution is now set in stone at the village centre.

Over the coming weeks the finishing touches will be put to the memorial, a chain link barrier to prevent vehicles encroaching onto the space, some granite benches, and a final seal and finish to the Portland stone will be completed. There may a little work to do on some of the base flags surrounding the stone too, but all this will be completed in the summer and early Autumn. Once this is done, and the group has claimed the VAT back from HMRC, EWMG will be wound up and all surplus funds will be given back to Euxton Parish Council to help look after the memorial going forward, they will be the custodians of this wonderful tribute for at least the next 99 years.

The website will continue to live on thanks to Euxton War Stories and the Heritage Lottery fund and myself and one or two from the group will come together again in 2016 to try and find somewhere to place 50 trees in Euxton, each dedicated to a name on our special memorial, a living legacy as well as a lasting monument.

So to those who came out on Sunday 12th July 2015, thank you for sharing a special moment in the history of Euxton. it was a very emotional day, extremely well attended and carefully organised.

From now on, on armistice day each year, Euxton can come together in one place to pay its respects to all of its fallen. We have done them proud.

Finally, in the words of someone very close and dear to me talking about the memorial and recorded by the BBC, 'I hope that Euxton is very proud of it, takes care of it, and honours it, I certainly will'.

#### **Busy Bodies Nursery** and a link to WW1

Susannah Knight was a pre-World War One Teacher of children, an educator of the French language to the wartime Chorley Pals (amongst other servicemen) and a biographer of the Chorley and District casualties after the war. Her memorial books, which includes some of the casualties from Euxton, are on display in Astley Hall. It is interesting to find that many aspects of her life are still in existence today.

In June 1895 Miss Knight bid farewell to St Mary's Catholic School in Euxton. She had been assistant Mistress for seven years but had chosen to resign in order to take the position of Governess to the children of a French Count. She must have made quite an impression as parents and scholars alike were sad to leave her leave and deemed it fitting to present her with a substantial token of their esteem. Miss Knight was presented with a silver watch inscribed, "Presented by the Children of St.Mary's, Euxton."

The school building where Miss Knight taught is still owned by the Catholic Church but currently operates as the premier child care facility in Euxton, "Busy Bodies."

Director Joanne Jump allowed me the time one recently to take some photographs of the remaining period features in the building which included the stained glass windows in the Anderton Chapel room.

Poignantly during this centenary period of World War One, children of Euxton continue to be educated in the same building and looked after in the same caring environment that undoubtedly Miss Knight did with the youth of the time who went on to join up during the war.

#### Bee Scene!

Over 30,000 children have already taken part in the wild flower survey since its launch in 2010.



Families can discover whether their local area is good for bumblebees by looking for bee-friendly wild flowers such as foxgloves, dandelions and clovers in their local green spaces and upload onto a virtual meadow map of the UK to help with understanding the importance of wild plants for our declining pollinators.

'Bee Scene' is a simple and effective way to encourage children and their families into their local parks or countryside - to enjoy them together away from the television screen, computer games and other pressures of modern life. By using a simple flower key, they are able to count different flower shapes and colours and look out for bumblebees, so helping children understand how valuable their local green spaces are for wildlife.



The "Euxton Remembers" book launched in May is still on sale at Euxton Library.

Last year Euxton War Stories received a grant to develop an educational legacy attached to the Euxton Memorial, which, quite poignantly, saw construction ground work begin last week. In the last twelve months the group has lead classroom sessions in local schools, conducted in depth research for local families, and presented a number of displays and exhibitions.

#### **Lancashire Time Credits**

Spice have been! working with County Lancashire Council and Chorley Em Council to introduce Time Credits. Time 🍩💢 Credits are a way of enabling local people to make a difference in their communities and local public services.



The programme was launched in September 2012 in Chorley with a broad health and social care focus and was extended to be used more widely across the community in 2014.

Time credits are a way of thanking people for the time that they give to their local community. If a person gives 1 hour of time to a community organisation, they earn 1 time credit that can be spent on a range of activities in the local area for example, an adult learning course, swimming, children's play centres and activities, a trip to a football match or a show at the local theatre.

As well as recognising the value of individual contribution, Time Credits strengthens and builds communities by engaging those who may not normally get very involved in their local area. The scheme encourages people to be involved in different ways and it helps to build local networks, by linking community groups, organisations and individuals.

Time credits are similar to bank notes but have no monetary value. They have a standard back in all locality areas with the front localised. In Chorley there is a picture of Astley Hall on the front of the note. The notes are designed and printed to make imitation or fraud extremely difficult.
