The Parish Council acknowledged the death of HRH Prince Philip with the flying of the flags, at half mast, around the Village, together with a minute silence at the April 15th Full Council Meeting. Some residents laid flowers at Balshaw Villa Garden in remembrance, together with a red roses laid by the Clerk on behalf of the Parish Council and the residents of Euxton.

Mr Neil Hall was co opted on to the Council at our March Meeting, after losing his seat in 2018 it's welcome back Neil!

Zoom meetings have continued for Full and Committee meetings and will do so until further notice, they are working really well thanks to our Clerk Debra.

The Allotment drainage work has been completed and a security fence erected. An Allotment Meeting on the 27th of May will be discussing the plot holders Licence Agreements, Policy and allocation of plots plus plans for an Open Day. Many thanks go to Cllr Eric Jones, Project Manager, for the time he has spent during the past year, good job he retired when he did as he has spent many hours pulling everything together, he is also the present Vice Chair of the Committee. Thanks also to the present Chair Cllr Chris Jones and Debra our Clerk for keeping the project on track during the past months, Covid or no Covid!

The Leisure Committee met on the 20th of May and around five new projects were discussed including the updating of part of the Balshaw Lane Play area. The Chair Cllr Helen Tune and the Vice Chair Cllr Steve Walker were voted into their positions at that meeting.

Sadly no Gala again this year but hopefully a smaller event may be possible later in the summer, fingers crossed.

Clean sweep

Council is accepting delivery of its new pavement sweeping machine in June after retiring our previous machine which was purchased in 2012.

The new machine is 'all electric' so it is quiet and efficient and chosen to fit with the Council's green agenda. Council will be bringing in the machine for a trial of 4 months until the end of September to assess its ability and purchase cost against hiring it in the more clement weather period.

As development of these machines progresses through the years they get more powerful in terms of suction but with enhanced filtering systems they are cleaner for the operative to use whilst giving a cleaner service.

It can pick up smallish materials which are either heavy or light - such as cans and litter on route, along with sweeping the detritus from the pavements, it also has a spray system so if its dry it keeps the dust down.

The sweeper rotates around the village pavements through the week. If the weather is really bad such as snow or terrential rain the unit would not be taken out but otherwise the village caretakers move around the village areas sweeping where they can access pavements (not roads).

If you feel your pavements in your street appear is in particular need of sweeping, drop the Council a quick email with your street name and what and where the problem is.

So, look out for the new machine out and about.



Green options

Council is looking for greener options to do tasks around the village and in this newsletter there are a few projects already completed such as planting trees, wildflower planting and going electric with machinery where possible.

Any ideas from residents will be welcomed.

Allotment Site update

Since my last report in the March 2021 Euxton Web the allotment site has substantially moved on.

If you remember the land was found to be waterlogged. We have now completed the installation of land drains to the whole of the site and even with the rain we have had in May there is a marked improvement on the site. The water is now kept on site in the improved ditches where it is allowed to soak away naturally and not allowed to flow into the surface water drains. We took this approach to prevent any flooding to Orchard Close or the houses on Sycamore Ave.

In early May the fencing contractor started the perimeter fence, I'm glad to say this has now been completed and the site is secure. The main groundwork's contractor John Finamore Ltd has been on site since the 26th May and is pressing ahead with the car park area, then the plot areas will be ploughed, rotivated, graded and then fenced. Each plot will have a shed provided on a hard standing with water butts to reclaim rain water.

The site will be completed by the end of July, providing the weather plays ball and we do not have as wet a June and July as May was.

The Allotment Committee will be meeting in the mean time to complete the plot holders agreement and policy. The allocation of the plots will be as the criteria described in the Allotment Policy, Euxton Parish Council will be contacting those who fit this criteria with an offer of a

Ginnel

Tree Planting

As part of the Council's green agenda it is taking suggestions for areas to plant new trees. It's drive to plant trees has started with two living Fir trees which can used at Christmas time, 15 flowering Cherry trees along Balshaw Lane in to Highways Avenue, one on Hawkshead Avenue.

A project on Euxton Lane will be planted up in June so will feature in our next newsletter. The Council is soon to consider the Queen 70 years Platinum Jubilee where she urges the public to plant trees to create a lasting legacy.

Besides tree planting, the Village Caretakers each year plant bulbs and plants to brighten up the village. Each year the Borough donates Daff bulbs and we plant in verges or on land needing a bit of colour. Also, this spring we were given supplies of various surplus bulbs via the Chorley Gardening Society.





From these additional donated bulbs we had some wonderful displays - the Tulips, which appeared to be double or Peony style came up a treat along Wigan Road at the entrance to Balshaw Villa Gardens and the special Daff bulbs called Replete were spectacular.

Any planting project ideas welcome.






Phone Kiosk given a new life

When BT contacted the Council about adopting the old, derelict looking phone kiosk as they were to be taking out the telephone equipment the Council was eager.

At just a cost of £1 the Council adopted the box from BT then had the electrics upgraded and commissioned a specialist company to refurbish the kiosk back to a former glory.





Another completed and very well received project of the Council has been the planting on Balshaw Lane/Highways Avenue.

Firstly borne out of an idea to try to soften the view of the side of the shops building which was first muted some years ago when hedging was planted, it failed because it was trodden down.

This project idea was reserrected with a new hedge, including a protective, but temporary, fenceline but also expanded. It now includes 15 flowering cherry trees planted and bedding plants in a bed created by reducing one half of the footpath width to be equal to the other half of the footpath when it was being re-laid.

The photos show the hedge being planted, Beech saplings and since then they are now greening up nicely.

Another part of the project overleaf on page 3 was the upgrading of the path which leads from the crossing on Balshaw Lane, across the land to the shops.

The surface had suffered from tree roots breaking up the surface and pushing up creating lumps and bumps.

The path re-building works created the ideal opportunity to carry out one big project all at the same time - the path, hedge and tree planting.

This has improved this small area alot and made it safer for people to walk to and from the shops.

In another 'Green Project' the Parish Council has added to these with some areas that it controls or obtained permission to plant up.



surgery (with its kind permission), an area on Balshaw Villa Garden and on Wigan Road just down from the last house after the Methodist Church which had been dug up for some services to be installed to new houses off Dunrobin Drive.

We hope these areas are all successful and brighten up the village.

Euxton Parish Council's Leisure Committee met recently and discussed a number of projects it wanted to move forward on and plan ahead for.

On the play area on Balshaw Lane, the original mini skate park is being planned out to be changed with new equipment to replace the now old and little used mini skate ramps. This revamp could incorporate a 'wet pour' surface, which is the spongy colourful tarmac some play areas.

Members of the Committee have plans to revisit the All Weather pitch facility at Greenside now the housing site has been completed - as they needed to link in to the main drains under this land so it was shelved until they had finished.

Further improvements to the Millennium Green including maintenance and possibly a new path route.

An activity or gym equipment area was discussed and the possibile location on the land off Southport Road, behind the green shelter could be ideal with a little work!

Looks like the Committee has some work to do!


